On any given day in Florida, approximately 800 children in foster care are available for adoption. November is National Adoption Month, a time to recognize these amazing children and consider becoming an adoptive family.

One of those children is Jimmy, whom I met at a reading event at the Florida Governor's Mansion recently. He is a 16-year-old, red-haired teenager with an infectious smile. I encourage Floridians to visit the website daily and become acquainted with the children and their dreams of belonging to a family

In every community in Florida today, children in foster care -- particularly teens, sibling groups and children with medical needs -- are available for adoption. They might be in school with your children, attending your church or temple, or playing on your child's sports team. These children need and deserve loving, supportive and permanent families. So many deserving children in foster care are waiting for a permanent family and a place to call home. While a private adoption can be expensive, adopting one of Florida's children in foster care costs little or nothing. In addition to changing the life of a child forever, Florida offers many benefits to adoptive families.

My husband, Rick, and I personally understand the difference adoption can make in a child's life. When Rick was a young boy and his mother remarried, her husband formally adopted Rick as his own son. This important step gave him the support and love every child deserves.

I hope "30 Days of Amazing Children: Explore Adoption!" will spread the word about the many children in foster care in need of the support and love of a permanent family. They are Florida's children. Their futures depend on actions that all of us can take today. Please encourage your family, friends and colleagues to meet these amazing children online.
